

Have your say in South Park & Woodhatch

Dear Resident,

I am writing to hear your views on what you would like to see in our local area.

Since I was elected as your local ward councillor at Reigate and Banstead Borough Council in 2016, I have worked hard on your behalf to make South Park and Woodhatch a better place to live for all of us.

I spend much of my time knocking on doors and speaking to residents about what matters most to them, and now, I want to hear your views on what you would like to see our allotted Community Infrastructure Levy money spent on.



What is the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL)?

CIL is a charge that the Local Authority puts upon developers to raise money for the infrastructure, facilities and services needed to support their new homes and businesses. CIL can make a real difference to local areas; I have previously supported CIL funding that went towards the outdoor classroom and renewable energy project at Dovers Green School, as well as the pump track on Sandcross Lane, and I want to know what you think we should spend it on next.

We could do a range of things—here are some ideas...

- Screening around the recycling bins at Trehaven Parade
- Funding towards improvements to New Pond Farm, for example a community orchard or a bridge over Earlswood Brook
- Benches at the pump track/skate park at Sandcross Lane
- Lighting at Woodhatch Park (which could coincide with the installation of the already funded outdoor gym)
- And many more!
